I didn't get this in the past. I would suggest just having sewer power be areawide except for Saxman. Currently Borough has sewer powers everywhere except for Saxman and the City of K. Power and public sewer being available are 2 different things. A cleaner way might be to say that regulation of the collection and disposal of septic waste is an areawide power, but is delegated to the City of Saxman within its limits and cannot be exercised in the City of Saxman unless the City of Saxman transfers authority as provided in the charter section on Saxman. You don't want to have just a service area deal or we couldn't require people to avoid open running sewage going on the beach or

Dear Scott:

The commission would like to bring the charter up-to-date with regards to wastewater and the current nonareawide situation. We were wondering if you had the time to look over the language in there and perhaps suggest modification(s) that might make sense in light of the changes over the past two years.

We are referring to Section 12.04(f) which currently reads:

(f) **Sanitary Sewage Service Areas**. The provisions of this Section 12.04 and Subsection 12.06(c) shall not apply to sanitary sewage services. The Assembly may by ordinance and without voter approval exercise sanitary sewage service powers on an areawide basis, service area basis, or a non-areawide basis in such manner as it determines. The ordinance may designate sanitary sewage services as municipal utilities under Section 8.01. The term sanitary sewage services means any collection, transport, treatment, or disposal of human waste.
